OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF MORGAN CITY SEPTEMBER 27, 2016

The Mayor and City Council of Morgan City, Louisiana, met at 6:00 pm (local time) in regular session, this date, in the City Court Building, Highway 182 East, Morgan City, Louisiana.

There were present: Honorable Frank P. Grizzaffi, III Mayor; and Council Members Ron Bias, Barry Dufrene, James Fontenot, Tim Hymel, and Louis J. Tamporello, Jr.

Absent: None

Also present were Mr. Marcus Folse, Chief Administrative Officer and Mr. Paul Landry, City Attorney.

The invocation was given by Reverend Tommy Fromenthal.

Mayor Grizzaffi read his annual budget message into record (copy on file).

Mayor Grizzaffi stated that St. Mary Outreach had requested use of the Petting Zoo for their annual Pick a Pumpkin activities and a letter was included in the packet. A motion to approve the use of the Petting Zoo on October 24, 2016 through October 29, 2016 was made by Mr. Hymel, seconded by Mr. Fontenot, and voted unanimously in favor.

Mr. Pat Cloutier addressed the Council regarding the September 16, 2016 LEPA board meeting. He stated that LEPA had voted to hire the Smith Courier law firm at \$395 per hour with a \$50,000 cap. He questioned what the City's portion of that would be. Mayor Grizzaffi stated that the City had a 10 megawatt ownership in the LEPA plant but the City would not be directly responsible for the bill. Mr. Cloutier also questioned the hiring of another law firm as well as questions about specific modifications to the plants that did not have to be completed. Mayor Grizzaffi asked that Mr. Cloutier submit all of his questions in writing and he would procure the answers from LEPA and share them with the local newspaper and television stations via a press release.

The minutes of the August 23, 2016 meeting were submitted. There being no corrections, additions, or deletions, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Reverend Bias, seconded by Mr. Tamporello, and voted unanimously in favor.

Mrs. Deborah Garber, Finance Director, submitted the following financial statement for the period ending August 31, 2016.

Attached is a summary that compares our actual revenues and expenses to our operational budget for our major funds subject to budgetary control for the period ending August 31, 2016. The following comments are related thereto:

<u>General and Ancillary Funds</u>: Actual total revenues are over budget by \$454,700, however, Sales taxes in General Fund remain under budget by \$171,300. Operating expenses are currently over budget by 135,200. The net loss, after transfers, of \$1,346,300 creates a favorable variance of \$319,400.

<u>Utility Fund</u>: Actual revenues remain under budget by \$64,000. Operational expenses are also under budget by \$483,000. Energy and gas costs are \$500,000 under budget. The net loss, after transfers, of \$233,700 creates a favorable variance of \$470,400.

<u>Sanitation and Sewer Fund</u>: The operating revenues are \$29,500 over budget, with total operating expenses under budget by \$215,400. The net income, after transfers, of \$421,700 leaves a favorable variance of \$281,400.

RESOLUTION NO. R: 16-24

WHEREAS, the City of Morgan City is committed to minimizing the amount of infiltration and inflow into the wastewater collection system and its associated impact on the design flow of the wastewater treatment plant, and

WHEREAS, the City of Morgan City has dedicated adequate budget funds to aggressively pursue location of and repairs to cracked and broken pipes in the wastewater collection system, employing both City and contract resources,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council, the governing authority of the City of Morgan City, that it hereby informs the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality that the following actions were taken by the City of Morgan City, Louisiana.

- 1. Reviewed the Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Audit Report which is attached to this resolution.
- 2. Set forth the following actions necessary to maintain permit requirements contained in the Louisiana Pollution Discharge Elimination System (LPDES) permit, number LA0065986:
 - a. Continued mapping of the wastewater collection system to characterize and document the size, type, and maintenance history of each main;
 - b. Continued systematic surveying and investigation of sections of the collection system to determine the extent and priority of repair efforts; and
 - c. Continued repairing and/or replacement of damaged sections of the collection system.

Mr. Tamporello seconded the motion.
