OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF MORGAN CITY NOVEMBER 28, 2017

The Mayor and City Council of Morgan City, Louisiana, met at 6:00 pm (local time) in regular session, this date, in the City Court Building, Highway 182 East, Morgan City, Louisiana.

There were present: Honorable Frank P. Grizzaffi, III Mayor; and Council Members Ron Bias, James Fontenot, Tim Hymel, Mark Stephens and Louis J. Tamporello, Jr.

Absent: None

Also present were Mr. Marcus Folse, Chief Administrative Officer and Mr. Paul Landry, City Attorney.

The invocation was given by Reverend Ron Bias.

There was no Positive Image recipient for the month of November.

Mrs. Renee Stansbury with the Louisiana Campaign for Tobacco Free Living and Mrs. Carla Vappie with Teche Action Clinic addressed the council regarding the Tobacco Free Policy. They presented the council with various statistics and a proposed policy that they wanted the council to consider adopting.

Representative Beryl Amedee addressed the Council with an update on the 2017 fiscal only session. She advised that the regular session began on April 10 and ended on June 8. She stated that the Bayou Chene project passed with flying colors. She advised she will continue to look for ways to cause the Government branches, agencies and departments to be more efficient and effective while providing the necessary services.

Mr. Pat Cloutier asked the Mayor if he had anything to report on LEPA. The Mayor stated that there was a LEPA meeting scheduled for Friday.

The minutes of the October 24, 2017 meeting were submitted. There being no corrections, additions, or deletions, a motion to approve the minutes was made by Reverend Bias, seconded by Mr. Fontenot, and voted unanimously in favor.

Mrs. Deborah Garber, Finance Director, submitted the following financial statement for the period ending October 31, 2017.

Attached is a summary that compares our actual revenues and expenses to our operational budget for our major funds subject to budgetary control for the period ending October 31, 2017. The following comments are related thereto:

<u>General and Ancillary Funds</u>: Actual total revenues are over budget by \$228,000. Sales taxes in General Fund remain over budget by \$40,500. Operating expenses are below budget by \$461,800. The net loss, after transfers, of \$2,031,300 is a favorable variance of \$454,700 compared to the budget.

<u>Utility Fund</u>: Actual revenues continue to be under budget by \$469,000, with operational expenses also under budget by \$20,200. Energy and gas costs are \$525,000 under budget. The net loss, after transfers, of \$1,609,400 creates an unfavorable variance of \$425,300.

<u>Sanitation and Sewer Fund</u>: The operating revenues are \$2,800 under budget, with total operating expenses under budget by \$109,000. The net income, after transfers, of \$1,070,200 leaves a favorable variance of \$815,800.

SECTION 1

BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council, the governing authority of the City of Morgan City, Louisiana, that:

Section 1

The attached detailed estimate of revenues as reflected in the consolidated statement, the supporting line item budget, and other such fiscal exhibits and information as required by the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act are ready for approval and adoption to serve as the Budget of Revenues for the City for the Fiscal Year January 1 to December 31, 2018.

Section 2

The attached detailed statement of expenditures as reflected in the consolidated statement, the supporting line item budget and other such fiscal exhibits and information as required by the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act are ready for approval and adoption to serve as the Budget of Expenditures for the City for Fiscal Year January 1 to December 31, 2018.

Section 3

The adoption of the Budget of Expenditures as reflected in the attached line item budget containing account object of expenditure classifications shall be declared to be the appropriation of the amounts set therein as established in each budget classification by object of expenditure.

Section 4

The amounts appropriated for all accounts shall not exceed the amounts fixed therefore in the Budget of Expenditures; however, nothing contained in this section shall be construed to prohibit the governing authority from amending or making an appropriation to and for a contingent fund to be used in cases of emergency.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, etc., that the budget for fiscal year January 1 to December 31, 2018, as attached hereto and made a part hereof be and the same is hereby approved.

Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase be declared unconstitutional or repealed for any reason, the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected hereby. That all laws or parts of laws in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed. This ordinance shall take effect immediately after its passage within the time prescribed by law.
