OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS CITY OF MORGAN CITY FEBRUARY 23, 2021

The Mayor and City Council of Morgan City, Louisiana, met at 6:00 pm (local time) in regular session, this date, in the Morgan City Municipal Auditorium Theater, 725 Myrtle Street, Morgan City, Louisiana.

There were present: Honorable Lee Dragna, Mayor; and Council Members Ron Bias, Steve Domangue, Tim Hymel, Mark Stephens and Louis J. Tamporello, Jr.

Absent: None

Also present were Mr. Charlie Solar, Jr., Chief Administrative Officer and Mr. Paul Landry, City Attorney.

The invocation was given by Pastor Ronnie Foret, Lighthouse Community Church.

There was no Positive Image recipient for the month of February.

Mrs. Edie Skiles with Pharr Chapel requested permission to close Everett Street between Second and Third Streets on Friday April 2, 2021 from 10 AM to 2 PM to have a drive thru for their annual Community Fish Fry. A motion to approve this request was made by Pastor Bias, seconded by Mr. Domangue, and voted unanimously in favor.

Pastor Bias stated that February was Black History Month and he wanted to give recognition to some African Americans that contributed to the City and Parish. Mr. Roland Turner was the first African American sanitation worker. Phillip Dural, Sr. was the first African American Assistant Fire Chief, Palmer Cox, Sr. was the first African American police officer, Buddy Coleman was the second, and Dennis Williams was the third. Mr. Williams served during segregation and was only allowed to arrest African Americans. Mr. Leon Hartman, Sr. was the fourth African American police officer. Mr. Roland Broussard was the first African American politician elected to the Parish Council from the City of Morgan City. Mr. Tamporello stated that one more name needed to be added to this list. He stated that Pastor Bias had served on the City Council for 17 years.

The minutes of the February 2, 2021 meeting were submitted. Pastor Bias stated that he wanted to add to the minutes A motion to approve the minutes with the addition was made by Pastor Bias, seconded by Mr. Hymel, and voted unanimously in favor.

Mrs. Deborah Garber, Finance Director, submitted the following financial statement for the period ending January 31, 2021.

budget for the period ended January 31, 2021.

Attached is a summary that compares our actual revenues and expenses to our operational budget for our major funds subject to budgetary control for the period ending January 31, 2021. The following comments are related thereto:

<u>General and Ancillary Funds</u>: Actual total revenues are starting the year over budget by \$88,554. Sales taxes in General Fund were over budget by \$33,784. Operating expenses are below budget by \$5,330. The net loss, after transfers, of \$58,000 is a favorable variance of \$93,884 compared to the budget.

<u>Utility Fund</u>: Actual revenues are under budget by \$356,000, with \$310,000 of that difference is electrical revenues. The operational expenses are also under budget but only by \$203,200. The net loss, after transfers, of \$140,000 creates an unfavorable variance of \$154,275.

Sanitation and Sewer Fund: The operating revenues are \$10,555 under budget, with total operating expenses under budget by \$47,110. The net income, after transfers, of \$68,149 leaves another favorable variance of \$36,587.
